<b>5. Features of University</b>
<p>APU serves as a truly unique example of international higher education. It was founded in April 2000 through the collaboration of three parties, Oita Prefecture, Beppu City and the Ritsumeikan Trust, one of Japan's oldest and most distinguished private non-profit educational institutions. Its founding values are the creation of a vision of freedom, peace and humanity and the enhancement of international mutual understanding in the Asia Pacific region. While APU is only in its ninth year of existence, it has already established a high reputation as the most international universities in Japan with a strong international orientation.</p> <p>Our campus currently has 5,963 students, of which 2,815 international students are from over 80 different countries. APU currently hosts the largest number of international students of any university in Japan. Of particular importance is the high percentage of international students in the total number of registered students, around 47%, which contributed to the creation of a multi-cultural ambiance on our campus. Our undergraduate programs are taught on a bilingual English-Japanese basis, while all the graduate programs are conducted entirely in English. The combination of APU's unique education system, career development support program and high aspiration of students has resulted in an impressively high employment rate for undergraduate students of over 95% for the last three consecutive years.</p>

<b>6. Features of Graduate school</b>
<p>The Graduate School of Asia Pacific Studies Programs at APU, which are taught entirely in English, offer a wide and flexible curriculum, to which students can tailor their own study program based on their interests and requirements in consultation with their supervisors. Approximately 40% of our faculty members are from outside Japan; and a significant number of our Japanese academic staff hold postgraduate degrees from world-renowned universities around the globe. Introductory and beginner's level Japanese language classes and an academic writing course are also available at no additional fee.</p> <p>Students in the International Cooperation Policy (ICP) Program acquire the knowledge required to develop a long-term perspective on development issues, as well as the capacity to address real-life issues by connecting theory to practice. ICP aims in particular to produce individuals capable of engaging in the actual practice of formulating and implementing development and aid initiatives.</p> <p>Classes taught in English make the most of APU's cultural diversity, and discussion is enriched by the variety of experiences our students have already gained in workplaces in their home countries. This is the ideal forum in which to prepare yourself for a career in international development on the world stage, and particularly here in the Asia Pacific region.</p>

## 7. Features of the Program

Master of Science in International Cooperation Policy

Students who have majored in the International Cooperation Policy (ICP) program acquire knowledge and skills required for the provision of assistance to developing countries. The ICP program was designed to develop capacity to address real-world issues by connecting theory to practice. ICP aims in particular to produce individuals capable of engaging in the actual practice of formulating and implementing development projects and other assistance. It is with this aim in mind that we established the four different areas of specialization within ICP: International Public Administration, Development Economics, Tourism Policy and Administration, and Environmental Policy and Administration. From 2007 we added a new specialization in Public Health Management which now includes 10 medical doctors amongst 14 enrollees. In these programs, we endeavor to integrate seminar-based research programs on specific topics with coursework into a curriculum which is highly effective in equipping students with the skills they will need in their future careers.

The APU graduate school education was designed to expose students to cultural diversity and enrich them through the experiences other APU students have already gained in their earlier work in their home countries. This is the ideal place for students to prepare for future careers in international development particularly in the Asia Pacific region.

## 12. Facilities

On-campus Accommodation AP House: Newly enrolled international students looking for a smooth and untroubled life can choose to live in AP House. AP House has a Student Support Center branch office and staff members on hand as well as student Resident Assistants, who support the acclimatization of new students to Japanese society and university life, as well as running exchange programs within the university. In addition to clean, modern rooms just a short stroll from the main campus, AP House boasts 24-hour computer labs, recreational facilities and plenty of communal space for interaction between residents.

Campus Facilities: Amenities for the exclusive use of graduate students include a spacious common room, computer lab, and individual study spaces for PhD students. There are a total of over 1,300 computer terminals available for student use on campus, all with high-speed internet connections. Students can use their own laptops to access the APU network via plug-in ports in several convenient locations. The APU library has an extensive collection of publications in English and Japanese, expanded by quick access to volumes in the Ritsumeikan University library in Kyoto. A wide range of journals are available for perusal through online databases. Other on-campus facilities include two cafeteria-style food outlets catering for a range of dietary requirements, a general store and bookshop, gym, tennis and basketball courts and a multimedia broadcasting studio.
